16. The Board of Education approved the following resolution for the Department of Special Services:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education hereby appoints the following Educational Services ("Firm") and approves the Agreement for Professional Services between the Board and the Firm(s) for the period from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. The Board shall pay the Firm(s) per the fee structure established, not to exceed as listed below, for school year 2012-13:

- Loving Care Agency to provide nursing services to a classified student, at a rate of \$54.00 per hour, not to exceed a total of \$46,000.00.
- Bayada Nursing to provide nursing services to classified students, at a rate of \$54.50 per hour, not to exceed a total of \$300,000.00.
- Summit Speech School to provide itinerant services for the hearing impaired, at a rate of \$150.00 per hour, not to exceed \$83,500.00.

17. The Board of Education approved the establishment of a Multiply Disabled Class (MD) at the Samsel Upper Elementary School (due to increased enrollment), for school year 2012-13.

18. The Board of Education approved the following resolution:

WHEREAS, a world class public education is essential for the future success of our nation and today's schoolchildren; and

WHEREAS, the Budget Control Act of 2011 includes a provision to impose \$1.2 trillion in across-the-board budget cuts to almost all federal programs including education that would become effective January 2, 2013; and

WHEREAS, these across-the-board budget cuts, also known as sequestration, would impact education by a reduction in funds of 7.8 percent or more and could result in larger class sizes, fewer course

offerings, possible four-day school weeks, loss of extracurricular activities, and teacher and staff lay-offs; and

WHEREAS, sequestration would impact almost every public school system in the nation and the millions of students educated through programs such as Title I grants for disadvantaged students, the Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), English Language Acquisition, Career and Technical Education, 21st Century Community Learning Centers, and more; and

WHEREAS, the Sayreville Public Schools, as well as other public schools, would be impacted nationwide by an estimated \$2.7 billion loss from just three programs alone – Title I grants, IDEA special education state grants and Head Start – that serve a combined 30.7 million children; and

WHEREAS, federal funding for K-12 programs was already reduced by more than \$835 million in Fiscal Year 2011, and state and local funding for education continues to be impacted by budget cuts and lower local property tax revenues; and

WHEREAS, states and local governments have very limited capacity to absorb further budget cuts from sequestration, as the Sayreville Board of Education has already implemented cuts commensurate to state and local budget conditions;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education, in the Borough of Sayreville, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey urges Congress and the Administration to amend the Budget Control Act to mitigate the drastic cuts to education that would affect our students and communities, and to protect education as an investment critical to economic stability and American competitiveness.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be sent to Senator Robert Menendez, Congressman Frank Pallone, State Senator Joseph Vitale, Assemblyman John Wisniewski, Assemblyman Craig Coughlin, United States Senator Frank Lautenberg, the New Jersey School Boards Association, and the National School Boards Association.
